7 Competition Rules and Methods

(1) Competition Rules

All events will be conducted in accordance to World Archery competition rules and the local organising committee.

(2) Technical Delegate

Yuko Okura (All Japan Archery Federation)

(3) Competition Rule

○ Competition method

- a) For the qualifications, only Recurve 50+ will have 2 athletes per target in a rotation of AB. All other categories will be conducted with 4 athletes per target in a rotation of AB-CD.
- b) Qualification rounds will consist of 6 arrows shot in 4 minutes.
The number proceeding to elimination round will be announced after the number of participants has been confirmed.
- c) In the Recurve Finals Round, archers will shoot a series of individual matches (set system), which consist of five sets (first to achieve 6 points wins).
In the Compound Finals Round, archers will shoot a series of individual matches (cumulative scoring).
Archers will shoot their arrows simultaneously in all matches, including medal matches (no alternate shooting).
- d) The 122 cm target face will be used in Recurve.
- e) The 6-ring 80 cm target face will be used in Compound.
- f) The 122 cm target face will be used in Barebow.

○ Scoring

Scores will be marked on paper and entered in electronic devices.

* You will be able to practice entering scores electronically at the Practice Field.

- Para athlete divisions are determined according to the bow type (Recurve and Compound). There will be no classification for the varying degrees of physical impairment (no wheelchair [W1, W2] or standing/sitting [ST] classes).
- Distance of each division will be the same as those of the General Divisions.

* *Classification Card will be checked at equipment inspection.*

* Only the Recurve, Compound in the age category of 50+ of men and women will be integrated into the World Archery Masters Championships hosted by WA.

9 Eligibility

- For safety reasons, it is advised participants should have adequate archery experience and are comfortable at shooting the distances of the event safely.
- Athletes competing in the Para Athlete Divisions must have a valid Classification card issued by their country's para archery federation (in Japan: Japan Para Archery Federation).

10 Age Requirement

Minimum age is 30 (born on or before 31 December 1992)

11 Medal Ceremony

In each event and age category, medals will be awarded to men and women winning first, second and third places.

12 Registration Fee

(1) Competition participation fee (including tax and handling fee)

- Competition participants (Basic fee: allowed to participate in 5 types of competition across all sport)
 - a) Overseas participants: 24,000 yen/person
(Including a transportation pass for mobility within the Kansai area.)
 - b) Domestic participants: 15,000 yen/person
(Does not include a transportation pass. Can be purchased at additional cost.)
- Official/Coach, Helper, Partner (Basic fee)
 - a) Overseas participants: 14,000 yen/person
(Including a transportation pass for mobility within the Kansai area.)
 - b) Domestic participants: 5,000 yen/person

(Does not include a transportation pass. Can be purchased at additional cost.)

* When a helper (a person who assists a para athlete in a competition) participates in the competition to provide support, he/she is not required to apply for participation and is not required to pay a registration fee (provided, however, that the helper must apply for participation as a competition official when he/she requires a participant's kit, transportation pass, etc.).

13 How to Apply for Participation

Application must be made using the entry system on the official website (Entry System) dedicated to the application for the entry to the competition via PC or smartphone.

14 Notes on Participation

(1) Clothing

- Athletes are to wear sportswear suitable for archery competition.
- Athletes must wear the competition number (bib) to be provided and distributed by the organiser in a visible and identifiable place.

○ Rules on transportation

Athletes are to bring their own sport competition equipment as it will not be possible to shipped in advance to the venue.

(3) Insurance (Accident, health)

The organiser will have accident insurance for participants, but this insurance is only applicable to “injuries incurred during the competition in the competition venues” of the “competitors and officials.”, and does not cover all risks athletes and officials may be exposed to throughout the Games. Participants shall arrange and

bear the cost of all other insurance coverage needed in advance for the period of the Games.

(4) Doping Control

○ Doping control in accordance with the [World Anti-Doping Code](#) and [the rules of the International Masters Games Association](#) shall apply to this competition.

(Alcohol test is also conducted)

○ Anti-doping activities (doping inspections and anti-doping education activities) shall be conducted in accordance with [the rules of the International Masters Games Association](#).

○ By entering the Games, participants are deemed to have agreed to be subject to doping control procedures in accordance with [the rules of the International Masters Games Association](#) upon entry to the competition. Participants are advised to check [the rules of the International Masters Games Association](#) Rules for more details.

○ This competition aims to promote anti-doping activities as an activity to protect clean sports and clean athletes in order to leave various values of sports to the next generation through sports in cooperation with the Japan Anti-Doping Agency.

(5) Procedure for Bad Weather

If the event cannot be held due to bad weather, the event schedule will be changed (and may be shortened).

16 Other Matters

All participants must complete the accreditation process before competition.

(1) Games Accreditation

Accreditation services shall be provided at the Opening Village, each Prefectural

Masters Village, Center Village, and the special service desks. The participant must bring a valid photo identification (passport) and complete accreditation process personally by one day before the competition (no exceptions allowed). Accreditation process can be completed at any of the designated service desks; however, operation hours and dates differ depending on the location.
